

Beautiful books, because of you!

Because of your kindness, something beautiful happened in May in Ifakara, Tanzania.

Together, we placed 13,500 books into the hands of children across 15 schools, nine different titles, each with 100 copies. But these aren't just numbers. They represent moments when a child's eyes light up: discovering a new story. They represent quiet afternoons when students gather around story books you made possible.

Teachers have added these books to their classroom libraries and report that their students' excitement has improved school attendance. Students are now able to bring books home and read aloud to parents and younger siblings.

The impact is real. CODE's Najmul Hossain saw this firsthand...

"During classroom visits, I observed most students reading with confidence and joy.

Their fluency and comprehension have improved significantly. Students were proud to demonstrate their progress and excited to share what they had learned."

This isn't just about getting books into children's hands – it's about ensuring girls and boys see their own culture, language, and experiences reflected on every page. When stories feel familiar, reading becomes personal. When reading becomes personal, learning accelerates.

Nine-year-old Magesa from Kiningina Primary School describes his favourite story, "I love stories about animals, especially the hare, tortoise, and elephant. It's good to have books with those kinds of stories in our classroom because I love to read."

Thank you for helping create these moments of joy and learning. You're giving these children the chance to see themselves as readers, as learners, as people with bright futures ahead. Your kind heart makes all the difference!






Today, Sallay is confident, happy, and independent. She continues to attend school, and thanks to you, the shelves in her classroom are now stocked with vibrant storybooks.

This Spring we got the wonderful news that Patricia excelled at her midyear exams and was promoted again, this time to Grade 4. Without GALI and your belief in her, she likely would be stuck in Grade 1 and even more likely to not be in school at all. It warms our hearts to see her excelling!



Sallay (Sierra Leone)

When we first met Sallay, she was struggling to stay in school because of the unfair barriers many girls like her face. When she did attend, it was hard for her to learn with very few books. We visited her last month, and because of you, her classroom now has more than enough storybooks for her and her friends. She wanted you to know that she is working hard in school and will continue to do her best because she wants to be a nurse. Thank you for thinking of girls like Sallay!

A lasting legacy — and a smart way to give

Compared to selling the securities, paying the capital gains tax, and then donating the cash proceeds, this approach is significantly more efficient for both your estate and the charitable impact you leave behind.

By planning ahead, your legacy gift can go even further in supporting the causes close to your heart and doing so in the most tax-effective way possible.
